MISSION

The Beautiful Project was founded upon the belief that art—creative expression—can be a healing and transformative force in people's lives. Our mission is to empower underprivileged children and adults through the creation of artwork.

HISTORY

Borne out of her passion for art and desire to share that gift with others, artist Pamela Sukhum, launched the Beautiful Project in early 2006 and has since worked to inspire and empower communities globally. In 2007, with the support of United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the Beautiful Project launched with its first trip to the Gaga refugee camp in Chad, Africa. There, she provided artistic workshops for 60 children and young adults with an emphasis on discovering their own creative voices and visions. The images created by the children were exhibited over the course of the Beautiful Project at Art Expo New York, the preeminent fine art exhibition in North America, where they were view by thousands of people. In 2008, Pamela expanded her program to additional refugee camps in Chad and the Central African Republic region of Africa. Thanks to our donors, we are able to provide training to the UNHCR and Unicef staff to continue to carry out the mission of the Beautiful Project in those regions today.
